Dear Parents and carers,

The children have continued to wow us in school with so many of them showing behaviours which are "above and beyond." I explained in my previous newsletter how as a staff we are looking at the book "When the Adult Changes, Everything Changes" by Paul Dix. One of the things that the book talks about is praising behaviours that are above and beyond the expected. This puts a real emphasis on high expectations which the children are really rising to.

You may have heard from your children that we have tweaked how they come into the dinner hall at lunchtime. Instead of coming down in year groups as they did previously we are trialling them coming down in house colour groups. This means that children from Year 1 to Year 6 are sitting together to eat. The children still have a number of friends from their class in each group. The beauty of this arrangement is that the younger children have older buddies now to help and look after them at lunchtime and the older children have an additional level of responsibility in helping and modelling good manners. Whilst the children were understandably a little unsure about this change at the start of the week they are now beginning to see the benefits. Two children in Year 3 have asked me this morning if we are doing it forever. When I said I didn't know but asked them why, they said that they like getting to know children in their house groups and that they have made some new friends. Other children have said how they love being able to eat with their siblings. The dinner hall is a much calmer place which leads to a much more pleasant eating experience for the children.

Thursday 4th October is National Poetry Day. We will be marking this in school by sharing lots of poems with the children as well as doing some poetry based activities.

I have been made aware of some unfortunate comments that have been posted on Facebook by parents. Whilst I fully understand that parents may on occasion be unhappy about something in school we can only put things right if we know about them. Posting negative comments about other children, families or the school causes upset and doesn't get anything solved. Please could I therefore encourage all parents to speak to us if they have a concern and refrain from sharing on it social media. Thank you for your cooperation.

Finally you may remember that I have previously explained about our intention as a school to become part of "Learning without Limits" Multi Academy Trust (MAT). Whilst we are still committed to working closely with the other schools in this group we have decided that at this moment in time we are no longer pursuing becoming an academy in a MAT. Myself and our governors are yet to be convinced as to the value both to our children and financially of converting. We will therefore continue to be a local authority maintained school working with the other schools in North Somerset who have also taken this decision.
