Dear Parents and carers,

I can't believe that we are half way through the term already! The children are really enjoying the new projects that they are doing and you should now have received the project information to give further information.

You will have received information earlier this week about a holiday club that we are looking to establish at school. It will be run by Sports to Schools (the staff are known to the children as they provide various activities every lunchtime for us). They already run two successful holiday clubs in Weston and are keen to roll this out to schools. We are planning to run a trial club during the February half term to see how successful it is. If the need is there we will then look to do this in other holidays too. We are very excited by this new venture as it will provide parents with quality childcare in the holidays for a very competitive price (£10 a day per child - 9am-3pm). Thank you to those parents who have already expressed in interest in this with the office. If you are interested and haven't let us know please drop the office an email - this is just to establish interest and is not a firm booking.

I would like to share a few reminders please:

- Could all parents please ensure that their children come to school in clothes that are appropriate for the weather.
- Could all parents please ensure that their children are coming to school in the correct school uniform, particularly school shoes as we are noticing a number of trainers being worn.
- Hot drinks should not be brought into the playground, even if in lidded cups. For information, staff on playground duty are not permitted to use containers of any sort for hot drinks due to obvious health and safety risks. Thank you.
- Please could parents of pre school children ensure that they are not riding wheeled toys around the playground in the mornings. There have been a couple of near misses where people have nearly been bumped into and we are keen to keep everyone safe. Thank you.
- Please regularly check your child's hair for headlice. If a child is seen to have live lice whilst in school parents will be asked take them home, treat and then return their child to school. This limits the opportunity for the lice to spread and also ensures that the child isn't embarrassed if they are spotted by other children.
