EYFS

• Percentages show numbers achieving a Good Level of Development (GLD) at the end of Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS.) A GLD is awarded when a child has scored 2s and 3s in the first 12 Early learning Goals (ELGs.) If a 1 is awarded for any of the first 12 ELGs a GLD will not be awarded.

HEADLINES

• The Year 1 cohort contains 2 children in receipt of Top Up Funding for their significant SEN. They both require full time 1:1 support. 1 child has Downs Syndrome and the other is autistic. The red figure shows the percentage with these 2 children removed from the data.

• This year's data shows an improving picture with the realistic Year 1 Phonic Screening outcome looking likely to be in line with national.

HEADLINES

- Key Stage 1 remains a key area for development as this year's figures have declined from last year's.
- The 2017 cohort has a number of children who present different challenges which the school are working hard to overcome.
 - o 1 child has Top Up Funding. This is to support his learning and behavioural needs (he did not attend a school for his reception year through parental choice.)
 - o 1 child has had significant safeguarding issues this year which have involved him having to leave the family home.
 - 2 children have had significant attendance issues that the school is addressing with the families.
 - o School are seeking advice from VLS to support at least 4 children's complex SEN.
 - o 23% SEN & 20% PP.
- Further, more detailed analysis of this cohort will need to follow in due course.

HEADLINES:

- Key Stage 2 presents a positive, encouraging picture.
- With the exception of writing, all cohort data is closer to national (or further exceeding national) than last year.
- The gap between attainment of Pupil Premium and non Pupil Premium children has narrowed in every subject, significantly in some areas.
- Writing and EGPS (particularly the spelling aspect) will need to be a continuing focus next year.

KEY HEADLINES FROM THIS YEARS DATA:

- ✓ EYFS Good Level of Development, Year 1 Phonic Screening and Key Stage 2 Data show an improving picture with many areas much closer to national figures.
- ✓ There is clear evidence that the gap is narrowing between Pupil Premium and non Pupil Premium children in many areas.
- > Attainment at Key Stage 1 must be improved.
- > Attainment in writing and EGPS (particularly spelling) at Key Stage 2 must be improved.
