You may be aware that NHS Test and Trace announced earlier this week, that all adults in households with school and college age children, without symptoms, can now access regular rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing.

These tests can be accessed:

- through your employer if they offer testing to employees
- · at a local test site
- by collecting a home test kit from a test site
- by ordering a home test kit online

As more workplaces begin to open we are really hoping that more children begin attending again. If numbers continue to be low we will need to review this facility. Please can I therefore encourage any parents who may need this provision, either now or in the future, to use it so that we are able to keep it running. Thank you.

Finally, thank you for your ongoing support and understanding. We all know how difficult the last year has been for everybody. I really hope that over the coming months we begin to get back to normality and that we can do all of the usual events that we would do in school. Please reassure your children that they will be back with their usual teachers on Monday and in their usual classrooms. Our priority next week will be to ensure all of the children feel safe and happy coming back to school. We will support them with activities to promote their positive mental health and will help them to learn to be with each other once again. We can't wait!
